

Protohistoric area excavation near Autun in Burgundy (France),



Place:

Saint-Pantaléon/Autun (71), Bourgogne-Franche-Comté region, France

How to get there: train to Strasbourg, train to Dijon and then to Autun

Conditions:

Excavation experience and good command of English or German or French.

Health insurance.

Period of participation is nine days. Housing with meals in Youth Hostel (Autun) is provided by the project. Travel-costs covered by the participant.


An alignment of about ten mounds a few meters high marks the landscape in the vicinity of Saint-Pantaléon north of Autun. The immediate proximity of these mounds with a thin seam of sapropelic coal (boghead coal or algae-derived coal), which is not visible at the outcrop any more, suggests that they could be witnesses to an exploitation of this rare and very peculiar raw material to the roman or protohistoric period.

The discovery in recent years in Switzerland of armlets made from this raw material and dated to the Hallstatt reinforces this hypothesis. The purpose of the excavation is to verify this hypothesis by studying the structure and composition of a mound and the adjacent depression, and to date these vestiges.
